Norwalk, CT beaches and parks no longer accept cash payments for entrance. **This change does not affect residents** and only applies to non-residents who pay to use the facilities. Residents will no longer be required to have a pass displayed to enter these parks.

Any resident with delinquent taxes will not be eligible for a Parking Pass until all delinquent taxes are paid. Please contact the Tax Collector's office at (203) 854-7731 to resolve any outstanding tax issues.

Residents can verify their vehicle information online at <https://nwlk.norwalkct.org/passes/>. If your vehicle is not listed on the Grand List due to purchasing/leasing a new vehicle you will need to come to Norwalk City Hall Recreation and Parks office walk up window with your current registration showing your Norwalk address. The walk up window is currently open Tuesday-Friday 9 a.m.-4:30 p.m. You can also email us at recreation@norwalkct.org.

RESIDENTS DO NOT NEED TO PAY FOR PARKING. Those who need to pay will do so via a mobile app called [Park Mobile](#) or paystation. The new cash-free parking system applies to Calf Pasture Beach, Shady Beach, including Taylor Farm, Veteran's Park, and Cranbury Park. There will be designated resident-only parking spots along the water at Calf Pasture Beach and the entire lot of Shady Beach.

Frequently Asked Questions

Do I have to pay to park?

Norwalk residents who are current with their tax payments and have a valid Norwalk registration with the Department of Motor Vehicles do not have to pay. These requirements are the same needed to obtain a Parks Parking Pass. Parking for non-residents is a flat fee and is not based by the hour like other locations in Norwalk. For non-residents, it costs \$40 on weekdays, \$65 on weekends and holidays, and \$20 after 5 p.m.

Do I still need a printed Parks Parking Pass?

To enter beaches and parks? No. However, residents will still need to display the paper Parks Parking Pass to park at Marvin School and will need a printed Disposal Pass to access the transfer station & yard waste site.

What if I'm driving a loaner vehicle?

If a resident has a loaner vehicle, they can request a temporary permit from the Recreation and Parks Department. Their license plate will be added to the online system allowing them to enter city parks and beaches.

What app do I use to pay for parking?

The app is called [Park Mobile](#) and is available on iOS and Android devices. It is free to download. Visitors can park and then pay via the app.

What if I don't have a smartphone or data plan?

Visitors can pre-pay for parking online or call a supplied number with payment information. There are also paystations available. A credit card or debit card is required.
